Important Notice - Change in Meeting Cancellation Policy

At the January meeting of the KANC Board, the Board had a discussion about the policy of KANC to cancel its luncheons or other events if the public schools in the area are closed. The Board made the decision to officially "suspend" that policy until the necessary changes to the Bylaws can be made.

Several factors led to this decision. One is that most of the venues where luncheons are held now charge a reservation fee - sometimes as high as \$250 - which is non-refundable if we cancel. The other part of the Board's discussion is that when that policy was implemented (possibly 50 plus years ago!), most of KANC's members were young mothers who may have had school-age children and would have had a challenge to find day-care for their children when the schools were closed. That is not the case today.

Therefore, KANC will no longer cancel a luncheon or other event just because area schools are closed. However, individual Special Interest Groups, can still decide to cancel an event (or make it a virtual meeting via Zoom as did the Book Club in January) due to weather or other reasons unrelated to school closings.

I am sure all of our members will understand this decision and agree that it is a necessary change to our policies and wonder why we didn't make the change years ago.
