Get to know our members: In Her own Words: Esther Cetina

When somebody ask you to write an autobiography, many questions about who you are given thought and the first thing that comes to your mind is, it is not easy to decide what were the most important events in your life, that marked your destiny and brought you were you were today. My journey is long so I've decided to tell the story of the circumstances and facts that brought me to United States so others will have have a little understanding of myself.

My name is Nidia Esther Cetina Castillo, and I was born in Mérida Yucatan, México, the 13th of July of 1967. My parents, both alive, are middle upper class and are a very close, conservative, catholic family.

I had a magnificent, awesome childhood, I remember always being loved and spoiled ~ my son and daughter, my two brothers, my cousins, my aunts, and other in laws, always found the perfect moment that brought our family together.

I married a doctor in 1992, who with time, became The Minister of Health of Yucatan.

During 3 years before the Governor election in 2012, both my husband and I, started to become involved in politics. In that time, I was supporting him in his new endeavor.

The Governor campaign in 2012 was a crazy time where literally every week night we had a meeting in our house, often with over 80 people and we did such a good job, this lead to my husband becoming the Minister of Health and this is when everything began to spin in my life:

drivers, secretaries, people in my house all the time, thousands of contacts everywhere and an unexpected job for me~I became the head of volunteers in all the public hospitals in the state. That changed my life, and the way that I see the world, my upper class bubble pump and I tried to do my best to help all this humble, poor and amazing people that I met during that time. I am so proud of all that we achieved as a group with my volunteers, and our fundraising events, that this only gave me fulfillment and peace in my life.

I started to contemplate a divorce, and finally received a divorce 2017, in a pre campaign year, because I received support from people I knew in power positions.

I always consider myself a liberal, and even more after my divorce, when I started to understand how difficult it is for a divorce women to navigate the society in Merida.

I had friends that stopped talking to me, and others, tried to changed my mind. My husband was famous and rich, so why I was trying to separate?, It was the real friends who stuck with me, the ones who thought what was the best for me.

During that time, I became a member of the expat community, so when I met Mark, my husband now, through facebook, during the pandemic, when I was living with my parents, and video calls all the nights with him, became so important to me. It was the light of my days.

It was then I started really think if I could be an immigrant, an idea that never ever crossed my mind!!!. When he finally propose to me, after a year, I knew that the path was not going to be easy, all that I have in México, all the friends and family I know, this secure place were I grew up, My culture, my language and the way we communicate, will change.

But I always consider immigrants, brave people, and for me, I knew the process will be easier. I have had a tourist visa since I was nine and all my life have visited different parts of United States once or twice a year. All of that played in my favor and I got my residence in 4 months.

Mark and his mom's support were fundamental stones for the new life I wanted to build, so I jumped and it has been the best decision in my life. I married Mark Geib in 2021 and I am going through the assimilation and acculturation process, getting new friends on the way, like these amazing women that are part of this group who opened their arms to me, since the first moment.
